### *A Message from the Superintendent. . . . .*

As we enter the summer months, it is a good time to reflect on the past school year and begin to prepare for the new one. Our preliminary test scores from the Ohio Department of Education are very good, and we are very proud of what our students accomplished during the 2009-10 school year. The first commencement on the new field turf was held on May 23<sup>rd</sup>, and the weather was beautiful. Congratulations to all members of the Class of 2010!

There are many activities going on this summer in the different buildings including athletic camps for individual sports, band and auxiliary practices, and summer school. Our maintenance and custodial staff are busy cleaning and preparing the buildings for the upcoming school year. Our computer technicians use this time of year to perform preventive maintenance on all computers, projectors, Smartboard's and other peripherals, network infrastructure and to update client software. Wireless networking infrastructure is scheduled to be installed in the Middle School in preparation for the 1 to 1 laptop initiative.

As our residents cope with a difficult economic climate, the Board of Education is committed to doing everything possible to control expenses. That is exactly what has been done over the last two years as our school district expenditures remain virtually unchanged. This has been achieved primarily by not replacing employees that retire or leave for other positions. In addition to those who left voluntarily, there have been several positions that were cut at the end of this school year that left people unemployed. These decisions are not easily made, and they do have a negative impact on the school district. However, Tri-Valley funding has been cut at the state level and the district has no viable alternative other than reducing expenditures.

The school year ended tragically with a bus accident that resulted in the fatality of kindergarten student, Kasey King. The accident is still under investigation by the Ohio State Patrol, but there is surveillance video that was taken from the bus immediately after the crash. Please keep Kasey's family in your thoughts and prayers this summer. As soon as the district has new information, we will be sharing it with Tri-Valley residents. Please refer to the school district website "Bus Routes" tab for information on policies, procedures, and statistics regarding student transportation. This site also provides links to the Ohio Department of Education Pupil Transportation Office.

Finally, I would like to thank the community members and neighboring school districts for their kindness and support of the school district and our bus drivers as we have coped with this tragedy. I ask for your continued prayers for the victims, their families, and our school bus drivers.

**CHILD FIND -- A SEARCH FOR ALL CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES**

Every school district has the responsibility of seeking out and identifying children in need of special education services. Although school-age children are identified through each building’s intervention assistance team and referral process, parents of children not yet enrolled, who reside within the Tri-Valley Local Schools boundaries, may not be aware that services are available.

What does a disability mean?

- For ages birth to 3: an established condition known to result in delay or a developmental delay.
- For ages 3-5: a documented deficit in one or more of the following developmental areas; communication, vision, hearing, motor skills, social/emotional/behavioral functioning, self-help skills and/or cognitive skills.
- For ages 5-21: identification of one or more of the following conditions: Autism, hearing impairment including deafness, mental retardation, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, emotional disturbance, specific learning disabilities, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury and/or visual impairment including blindness.

***Curriculum . . . Mrs. Jean Lahna, Director***

During the 2010-2011 school year, foreign language opportunities at the high school include Mandarin Chinese I, Mandarin Chinese II, American Sign Language I and American Sign Language II, taught via video conferencing. Students who need to continue their studies with French II, III or IV will have the opportunity to enroll in online courses to earn their foreign language credit. Online curriculum opportunities, with Apex Learning, will again be an option for high school students to address scheduling conflicts, to enroll in AP courses, to access AP test prep materials, and to accelerate curriculum studies. New to the course offerings are Pre-Veterinarian and Small Animal Care, both semester courses. These courses are designed for students wanting to pursue a career in the veterinarian field.

In the 2010-2011 school year, 8<sup>th</sup> grade students could acquire a maximum of 3 ½ high school credits through course offerings which include: Physical Science, Algebra I, Art I, High School Marching Band, Mandarin Chinese I, American Sign Language I, 8<sup>th</sup> grade Music Appreciation, and 8<sup>th</sup> grade Art Appreciation. American Sign Language I, a new course offering in 2010-11, and the return of Mandarin Chinese I, will be taught via video conferencing so students can earn one high school foreign language credit. Students are eligible to enroll in the accelerated credit programs with selection criteria established by district guidelines. All of these course offerings at the middle school level provide opportunities for our students to accelerate their skills with curricular and co-curricular classes.

Congratulations to our Tri-Valley students in grades K-8 who read 94,184 books with the Accelerated Reader program for the 2009-2010 school year! Accelerated Reader (AR) is a computer-based, reading management program designed to motivate students to read more and develop a lifelong love of reading and learning. Keep Reading Tri-Valley!!

***Treasurer . . . Mr. Ryan Smith***

The completion of another fiscal year is fast approaching. We have seen a lot of changes in the financial landscape of the district. We have seen a major influx of funding from the federal government in the form of stimulus money. These funds have come in the form of general operating money and increases in Title money. While these funds have been a needed addition to our budget, they did not necessarily create any “new” funding. General fund receipts for the fiscal year will be down compared to prior years. We have seen other funding sources from the state reduced or eliminated, such as the bus

purchase allowance, early learning initiative funds and reimbursements for high cost education opportunities that are required by law. We also experienced greatly reduced levels of investment income due to lower cash balances and the reductions in interest rates offered by financial institutions. The district has had to reduce the level of expenditures from prior year levels in order to balance the budget based upon these changes. This was accomplished by not replacing the positions of retiring employees, savings in maintenance costs that were paid out of our building maintenance fund and freezes on purchasing in all other areas. The district, from the board down to the individual employee level, has made a commitment to balance the budget through these types of reductions as best we can. The next biennial budget that comes out from the state will be the most anticipated budget in some time due to the economic uncertainty here in Ohio. We will provide updates as soon as they become available.

Thank you for your support of the Tri-Valley school district. We appreciate all that you do. Go Scotties!

### **Important Changes to the Free and Reduced School Meals Program and Direct Certification for Free School Meals for 2010-2011**

Ohio public schools are required to waive the instructional fees for students who qualify for free meal benefits. A fee waiver is used for waiving the cost of courses taken and testing fees associated with the courses, mandatory supplies needed for a course or other testing fees for the ACT and SAT.

**Information regarding this new change is located in Part 5 of the Free and Reduced Meals Application for 2010-2011.** School food personnel must have parent/guardian consent to share your student(s) meal application if your student(s) qualify for a fee waiver. If you agree to allow your student(s) meal application to be shared with school officials to see if he/she/they qualify for a fee waiver, then check “yes” in Part 5 and sign Part 5 (*the signature is very important*). If you do not wish for that information to be shared, then check “no” in Part 5 and sign Part 5. Answering “no” to this question will mean your student(s) will not be able to be considered for a fee waiver. Answering this question “either way” will not change whether or not your student(s) will receive free or reduced price meals.

If your student received free or reduced meal prices for the 2009-2010 school year, **a new application for the 2010-2011 school year must be submitted and approved prior to October 5, 2010.** If the new application has not been approved by October 5th, your student(s) will be charged the full meal price beginning on October 6, 2010. Applications are available at our web site at [www.tvschools.org](http://www.tvschools.org), under Downloads or forms will be sent home when school opens.

**Direct Certification for Free Meal Benefits:** The Ohio Department of Education (ODE), Office for Safety, Health and Nutrition provides Tri-Valley the opportunity to directly certify enrolled students for free meal benefits in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs. Students are directly certified by ODE from information provided by the Muskingum County Department of Job and Family Services. The information includes the student’s name, birth date, parent name and address. The list of qualifying students is then sent to Tri-Valley in mid-July. *Households receiving this letter will not need to complete the Free and Reduced School Meals Application for the 2010-2011 school year.*

Prior to the start of school, households with students who have been directly certified will receive an Eligibility Notification Letter from Tri-Valley indicating that their student(s) have been approved for free school meals. **It is important that you read this information.** You may have other students living in the household that are not listed in the letter who would qualify for free school meal benefits. Also, a **Fee Waiver form** regarding consent to share information will be included for you to sign and to be returned to your student’s building at the start of the school year. If you do not wish for your student(s) to receive these benefits, **you must sign** the form included and return it to the school.

If you have students who are not listed in your letter, please contact the Tri-Valley District office as soon as possible at (740)754-1442, prior to the start of school on August 25th, to ensure that those students receive free meal benefits the first day of school.

***Important information regarding the TV text/email messaging service.*** The text message and email announcement is a free service that allows residents to receive email and text message notifications for events such as delays, closures and early dismissals, sports related information, and upcoming special events. Subscribers will need to register on an annual basis. A message will be sent asking you to re-register your account in early July. This keeps the registration information fresh and also allows for new notification categories to be added. Residents can still sign up for text messaging or email alerts on the school website at [www.tvschools.org](http://www.tvschools.org).

The 1 to 1 laptop committee met with the parents support group for the project in May. Middle School Principal, Jennifer Penczarski, presented a video describing the project. 
The class of 2010 had 252 potential candidates for graduation with 227 attending the ceremony held at Jack Anderson Stadium. The student speakers were Brandyn Davis, McKenzie Huston, Cody Page, and Alyssa Miller who represented their class well. The event was held on a warm and sunny day for a beautiful ceremony. Donnie Thomas was selected as Muskingum County’s Franklin Walter Award winner and received a \$1000 scholarship. Donnie also attended a regional luncheon held in Columbus where recipients from all 88 Ohio counties gathered. Heather Izer won the Susan Mahoney Writing Award. Alex Williams was nominated as a top student at TVHS, and he selected Ms. Amanda Blevins as his most influential teacher from his thirteen year educational career. All were honored at a ceremony held at the Muskingum Valley Educational Service Center. Jessica Moyer was nominated by Mrs. Jamie Starrett as this year’s recipient of the Rotary’s Phoenix Award. She was honored at a luncheon held at Bryan’s Place and at the senior awards assembly. She received the award as being a student that overcame major health issues and still continued to perform well in the classroom. Jessica plans to attend University of Cincinnati next fall.

Tri-Valley won the All Sports Trophy again this year and several athletes earned special accolades. First place finishes in the league were achieved by the soccer teams, volleyball, football, girls’ basketball and baseball. Allison Stillwell participated in the state meet for cross country, Matt Kaido qualified for the state golf match, Jordan Edgerly earned the opportunity to compete at the state track meet for shot put, and Macie Warner competed in the pole vault at the state meet at the Jesse Owens Track in Columbus. This was Macie’s second year to advance to the state meet. Eli Martin earned All-Ohio status for baseball and Clay Cameron earned All-Ohio status for the second year, Coach Buttermore’s football squad advanced to the state playoffs making their third appearance in school history. The team lost to Olentangy 21 to 28.

Academically, the results of the OGT’s or spring testing have been received. The 10<sup>th</sup> grade results will have achieved all five indicators. Additional meetings and strategies will be held this coming year to help the targeted groups achieve their goals and prepare for next year’s test. This year was the second year for the STEP group (a specially designed group of teachers/administrators) in place to help students in need. The committee met when a referral was made and action plans were established to try and help students struggling from any outside influences and a follow-up plan was put in place as well. The school year concluded with the junior class being challenged to become leaders over the summer and be a positive influence for younger students for next year.
